

TACTICAL INTERROGATION REPORT
IPW TEAM 60-B, 134TH INFANTRY

- ✓ 16 PW of the 110th Armd Inf Regt, 11th Co.
- ✓ 2 PW of the 1126th Regt, 8th Co.
- ✓ 1 Officer of the 1st Btry, 401st Army Arty Brigade.

The 11th Co, 110th Regt, has a strength of approx 100 men. Among their weapons they have 14 small bazookas. The CO is Lt Goetschel, The Bn CO is 1st Lt Dalhausen.

The regiment came to this sector yesterday morning from vic Denting near Boulay. PW state that the 111th Regt is also part of the 11th Armd Div, but do not know the the 111th is in this vicinity.

PW from the 8th Co, 1126th, state that the 2nd Bn retreated the day before yesterday towards Fonteny. P/W were attached to the 6th Co which had one platoon of 30 men in a large farm between Laneuveville and Fonteny, 2 km from Fonteny. From here PW observed 50-60 German tanks passing by near the farm in direction of the front.

The captured German lieutenant commanded an AT gun battery and had gone forward for observation when he was captured. His unit had lately arrived here by rail from Pilsen. The btry consists of 6 75mm AT guns towed by tractors.

One PW, captured this morning, came by motorcycle from the 3rd Bn trains 110th Regt, which are at Francaltroff. He was sent to vic Chateau-Salins as replacement driver for the 3rd Bn. Upon arriving at Gerbecourt he was captured by the Ren Troop. PW saw no tanks this morning, only a burning German Ren car at Vaxy. Near Dalhain a column of 20 covered trucks passed him in direction Morhange, but he could not see whether they were loaded or not.

Another PW from the 6th Co, 1126th, states that our artillery dispersed his Co and made many casualties.

2 PW of the 57th Armd Engr Bn.
Captured by 3rd Bn.

PW state that one platoon of 30 men from their Bn was attached to an Armd Div here. They arrived here early yesterday morning on 4 half-tracks from a rest area near St-Avoid.

The mission of these Engrs was to clear the mines in front of their tanks in case of a German counterattack. All they did yesterday was to act as security on a wooded height.

PW state that they got surprised by American soldiers this morning and had to abandon one halftrack at the place of capture.

They did not see German tanks, but could hear their motors during the night.
