REPORT ON PWS TAKEN BY 1ST BN.

PWs from 1st Bn 111Reg 11Pz and from 2nd Bn 37 Reg 17 SS

PWs from 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Cos 1st Bn 111 Reg 11 Pz state their Cos down to about 40 men per Co. They now have 1 heavy MG, 3 light MG, and 2 mortars. PWs report they withdrew last night from Remering to vicinity of Grundviller. Attathed to 1st Bn are 30 engineers and 5 80mm mortars and crews.

PWs state moral of their unit is low, but that they have good food and plenty of ammunition and mines.
PWs state their losses are heavy from our artillery fire.

PWs from 5th, 6th, and 7th Cos 2nd Bn 37th Reg 17thSS state the 6th Co still has 100 men and 9 to 15 MG. but 7th and 5th Cos are down to 30 men each with 1 heavy MG, 6 light MG, and 8 AT gernades per Co. They too withdrew from Remering to the vicinity of Grundviller last night (the last unit left Remering at 0700 this morning). The engineers and extra mortars which were attached to the 2nd Bn were detached 5 days ago at St Avold. PWs state moral of their unit is low, but that they have good food and plenty of EMMUNIXIXEM ammunition and mines. PWs state their losses heavy from our artillery fire.
